Welcome to the 2019 Academic Year

Our College staff are working in partnership with each student and their families, to ensure that each boy receives a Catholic Education that values excellence and continuously challenges everyone to achieve their best. As an inclusive school we are focussed on developing the holistic learning of each individual student – the spiritual, intellectual, physical, social and emotional.

Our 2018 Year 12 results and destination choices highlight that our boys have different pathways and undertake opportunities to learn or serve others in a variety of fields. All VCE students achieved their VCE certificate and the 15 VCAL students each entered into an apprenticeship or have entered into further study. Congratulation to our 2018 College dux Adam Bardrick 98.65, runner up dux Christopher Le 98.25 and top performing international student Yuan (Sam) Ma 90.65. These students highlight that our boys can achieve exceptional results by implementing key strategies and through hard work to improve their learning

College staff have analysed the results of each subject, the Year 11 and 12 cohort, and individual results. This is allowing us as teaching staff to improve our practice and subsequently improve the learning and academic results of our current students.

As a College we are challenging each student to achieve his best and have high expectations of him achieving very good results. Our intention is to communicate to you if your son is not performing at or above his expected level of achievement and put in place interventions both in the classroom and after school in the academic study centre.

I recently had the privilege to speak to our Year 12 students at Deakin University. I shared my own experience of running a marathon and how this is like study in Year 12. Marathon race day is the examination period and the training are the learning, study and assessments throughout the year. In sharing my own journey of training for and running a marathon, I articulated the need for a student to value excellence and to challenge themselves to achieve personal best. To complete the examinations, students must set a goal, plan and organise, practice, ask for feedback, seek support from peers and those with expertise, access resources (Whitefriars Learn, Edrolo, academic study centre and holiday study programs) and persevere when it gets difficult. I reassured each student that you set your goals and high expectations, to work through difficult times and know that others have been there before them in completing Year 12.

Whitefriars Engage

Whitefriars Engage, our learning management system, will provide you with information about your son's learning and wellbeing. The College encourages parents to log in regularly to access information about your son's subjects – lesson plans, homework, assessments, academic results and feedback. This will allow you as parents to have important conversations with him about his learning, organisation, improvement strategies and motivation.

Computational and Algorithmic Thinking Competition – CAT 2019

The Mathematics Faculty is again running the annual Computational and Algorithmic Thinking Competition, formally Informatics, in 2019. Selected students from Years 7 to 10 will participate in the CAT Competition on Tuesday 2 April – more details about this to be released shortly.

What is CAT? It is the mathematics underlying computing, communication and the Internet. It is the study of the structure and behaviour of natural and artificial systems that generate, process, store, and communicate information. Students competing in CAT learn the basic algorithms, data structures and computational techniques that underlie information and communication, and demonstrate the learning through computer programming tasks.

School procedure for bushfire season



The 2019 bushfire season is of strong concern to our College. As a community we live and study in a bushfire prone area and are therefore subject to the implications of such events. We may be impacted directly or indirectly by bushfire events. We encourage all families to make sure they have an effective fire safety plan that they have practiced.

As a College we have our own plans and procedures leading up to the fire season (prevention measures and consultation) during the fire season (ongoing monitoring of conditions) and during a bushfire event (Bushfire Procedures).

These specific bushfire procedures are tested in Terms 1 and 4.

During times of heightened bushfire danger, the school leadership evaluated the available information (including weather forecasts and liaison with Emergency Services) to determine the safety of students on campus. Where conditions are such that it is unsafe for students and staff to be on campus (e.g. confirmed fire threatening the area) the leadership will communicate site closure with the college community via:

- The School Website
- SMS / Email
- ABC and local radio
- Letters for students to take home

Management of the site during these times can be a burden, therefore in response to outgoing communication, we request that parents, staff and students only contact the College through the following designated means:

- Whitefriars Engage (Parent Portal)
- Email – info@whitefriars.vic.edu.au
- Phone 03 9872 8200

Please note that if the school has been evacuated no one will be on site to take your call and other forms of communication or access to devices may be impacted by the emergency. Staff will endeavour to deal with the incident, so please do not distract them from seeing to the safety of the students.

If parents and guardians have provided their children with mobile phones, they should not call them. Making contact with parents and guardians may distract students from listening to instructions from staff and endanger their safety. Students will be advised by their teachers when they can safely use their mobiles to make contact.

If parents and guardians are on the phone with their child during an incident, they should provide them comfort and assurance. Students may become agitated and panicked if they hear fear in the parent or guardian's voice and this may hamper staff in ensuring discipline.

Welcome to the 2019 Academic and ACC Sporting year. As a College, we firmly believe that student's participation in sport whilst at the College assists them in developing the knowledge, understanding and skills to strengthen their sense of self, as well as building and maintaining relationships. It also helps students to be resilient, make decisions and take actions to promote their own health and physical activity participation going forward. Whitefriars College is a part of the Associated Catholic Colleges (ACC), where we compete against other Catholic Boy's Colleges around the state in many sporting fixtures and runs in accordance with the ACC motto of 'Excellence, Honour & Fairness' in student activities. It is an expectation that all students make themselves available for ACC Sport representation and training, if required, and that ACC school sport is one of the main priorities during the week.

Year 7-10 Sport

Late last year, students in Years 7-10 submitted their sport preferences for each 2019 term. Students should have received email confirmation of their enrolled sport for Term 1.

Students are expected to attend their chosen sport on time. Students will not be able to swap or join other sport sessions due to transport/staffing/timetabling/facility bookings etc. that were made based on the boys' choices. We understand that some students may have had a change in heart with their choices, but unfortunately, we are not in a position allow changes. Students are welcome to come in to speak to us about this if they would like further clarification.

Student Uniform

All students are required to wear correct Whitefriars College sports uniforms on their designated sport afternoon, including shorts, polo, white socks and runners with correct support. No long sleeve shirts, Skins, leggings etc. are to be worn under the uniform. Any alternative garments must be accompanied by a signed note from parents, indicating why the student is out of uniform.

If a student is playing ACC representative sport, he also must wear correct uniform and only change into his ACC uniform at the start of the activity in the afternoon.

Due to very hot weather in Term 1 every student is expected to bring a hat (sunscreen will be available) and wear appropriate Whitefriars sporting attire.

College Services

Year 7 and 10 Immunisations

Parents of Year 7 and 10 students should have received the vaccine consent card booklet recently sent home with your child. The cards are due back to Student Reception at the College by Friday 22 February. You need to read, complete and return Part A regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school. We hope that you understand that immunisations are an important part of keeping everyone safe and healthy. To ensure efficiency of the program on the day, we rely on the students and parents completing and returning the cards on time.

The Year 7 vaccine schedule includes:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis combined vaccine (dTp) – one dose
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine – two doses

The Year 10 vaccine includes:

- Meningococcal ACWY – one dose

Common post-vaccination side effects are usually minor and do not usually require treatment. Paracetamol and placing a cold, wet cloth over the injection site can help to alleviate discomfort at the injection site.

The Manningham City Council immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Please contact Helen Kelly via email hkelly@whitefriars.vic.edu.au by Friday 22 February, if you do not want your contact details given to the Manningham City Council.


