In my valedictory address to this fine group of young men I spoke about the inspiring way they responded to all that befell them in the last two years with positivity, inventiveness, a strong sense of camaraderie and a love of their College.

They would not allow a pandemic to diminish their year. More so, they have not allowed the challenges of the last two years to define their senior experience at Whitefriars. They have made a conscious decision to accept the situation as it is and to just get on with it.

Our VCAL students also achieved excellent results with the majority having secured apprenticeships or other employment.

Our VCE Dux Roger Luo achieved an outstanding ATAR score of 99.45. This is a testament to Roger's diligence and dedication. This year Roger will take up a place at The University of Melbourne where he will study Science/Engineering.




#### **Darcy Fenech**
